Summer Greetings Savoyards! Rehearsals have begun and we're starting to make plans for staging, costumes and set for August's production of *Ruddigore*, last performed on our stage 18 years ago in 2004!

Given the outlook of COVID-19 for the fall, and current rates of cases in Dane County, we will require audience members to wear masks while in the Bartell Theatre.

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Ruddigore is an old work, opening on January 22, 1887 at the Savoy theatre in London. In the 125 years since its first performance, the sun has risen and set on the British Empire, seven monarchs have held the crown, and taste in popular music has changed radically several times. The relationships that people have to society at large have been reinvented more than once in that time. So when you reach for the old score with the gingerbread cover, how do you connect the modern viewer with it?

Gilbert and Sullivan help us out a lot in the effort to make the show fresh. Gilbert lampoons both 19th Century melodrama, and the Gothic horror genre, which many others have done since. Gilbert then goes beyond that eternally entertaining format, and uses it to skewer the social hypocrisies that people had to live by and mate by in that time (to which we may be returning).

Sullivan's music was cutting edge at the time, and the score feels very modern as it sets the mood for the story, and reveals sensations that Gilbert's characters are not permitted to put into words. Some consider this score to be the finest the the composed for any of the Savoy operettas. Our production will have an intimate staging, with a reduced orchestra and piano to accompany our cast.

I wanted to set the production in a world that would appeal to modern audiences from many backgrounds. To that end, I have put this show in a steampunk universe: a place with bright colors that cut through the smoke; a world animated by the visceral power of steam and clockwork. It's a fantastic world that frees us from historical limitations, and allows us to focus on the fun!

When Ruddigore was first p oduced in 1887, the Victorians considered its title offensive. Originally, the play was spelled "Ruddygore," but the Victorians thought this was a parody of the word, "bloody," a word that was never used in polite society. But when the spelling of the name was changed to "Ruddigore," it didn't seem to help. The Victorian audiences didn't approve of all the supernatural happenings. And when in the second act a woman sings a duet with a man who is supposed to be dead, the Victorians were appalled. The idea of people having interactions with ghosts was considered very bad taste.




