A Note from the President... AND Stage Director

Happy 2018 Everyone! If you like piña coladas, and gettin' caught in the rain, then you're gonna enjoy **Die** Fledermaus this summer! It is a new year of celebration for Madison Savoyards, Ltd.; not only are we trying out repertoire that's new to us, we are celebrating our **Emerald** Anniversary – 55 years of theatre! This is a milestone only a handful of theatre companies in Wisconsin can boast, and we are thankful to every single person that has performed, served, volunteered, and donated to our organization over the years. The board and I are working hard to make it 45 more!

We would not have survived without the support of you, our generous donors, who have helped us through seasons of abundance and meager returns. As we mount *Fledermaus* this year, we look to you for your continued support. We are seeking suggestions for businesses and individuals to help underwrite specific costs for our season. Our November 2017 letter noted several expenses-- our orchestra (approx. \$17,000) and the rental of Music Hall (approx. \$8,500). Over the last year the board has sought corporate and new individual support, and we are turning to you for help identifying new connections and resources to help alleviate these costs. Please reach out to me, or any board member, with suggestions of whom to contact.

Likewise, the board is listening--

we have been for a while! Several iterations of our board debated expanding our repertoire in previous seasons. Audience members, donors, and performers have suggested it in addition to the granting organizations to which we apply. We heard this question most, "What are you doing that's different that sets MSL apart?" We looked at our mission statement:

...to preserve the works of Gilbert and Sullivan and other light opera by producing and promoting live performances; todeveloptheskills and talent of cast, crew, and musicians of all ages; and to inspire, entertain, and educate the community through performances and other initiatives.

In concert settings we have previously offered non-G&S works, and last year we debated and researched the possibility of offering other light opera as our main stage production. We asked throughout last season for feedback and received positive affirmations, cautions of the future, and negative critiques. I want to answer some of the most common concerns brought to us.

We are not abandoning Gilbert & Sullivan. The fact is some shows do not draw the same audience as the big 3, and subsequently the return for the company is low on several fronts. Occasionally we need to offer something different in the operetta/light opera repertory that is going to (1) excite & educate audiences, (2) excite & educate performers, and (3) keep the company fiscally responsible and strong.

We are dedicated to continue performing in English! I am sure everyone started to brush up their German and cook schnitzel in preparation for this summer, but we'll amend our title to *Die Fledermaus, or The Bat sung in English* as a way to help audiences feel more invited and know they'll understand the words. (Additionally, we're investigating supertitles as well.)

What's going to happen next year? The board and I are working on mounting a long-term passion project of former board president James Cain in his honor. I don't want to spoil too much, but this year's curtain speech I promise will contain the announcement of next year's show, which is a return to G&S!

Now, if you're still looking for your G&S fix this year, we've still got it this season! We have our **Topsy Turvy Cabaret** coming up in March

AND we'll have special guest appearances from previous performers with a couple glimpses at our upcoming Fledermaus cast! We encourage you to wear a mask or your favorite topsy turvy outfit to help us celebrate. The show starts at 7:30 at the Brink Lounge, but we'd like to meet you before and socialize from 6:30 to showtime! Come start a delicious tab and see our cabaret!

I am also excited to announce **Fledermaus** as my directorial debut! I wear many hats now other than being a performer and voice teacher; board president, professor, business owner, and now director. My minor while in school was opera production and stage direction, and I relished my time on stage with Bill Farlow. The story of *Fledermaus* is a great tale of misdirection, misconception, and masquerades with many comedic moments I cannot wait to stage! Our translation this summer is adapted from Gilbert's On Bail, which is a translation of the original play, Le Réveillon. Gilbert often provided translations and burlesques on the works of Donizetti and Offenbach in addition to his collaborations with Sullivan. You'll hear alliterations, patters, and even a few original lines too! Kyle Knox returns to us to conduct a resplendent orchestration full of waltzes and tuneful melodies to keep you humming as you leave the theatre. Rebecca Stanley will costume our modernized concept and dazzle with her gift. These are only a handful highlights you won't want to miss!
