In his teenage years he identified with Gilbert's contempt for hypocrisy and with the passion in Sullivan's music. As an adult, he enjoys performing in the operettas, and presenting the wit and music of Gilbert and Sullivan to contemporary audiences. "To me, the works of Gilbert and Sullivan are a catalogue of human foibles (Gilbert) and human emotion (Sullivan), and I daily refer to their works as amusing allegories to life's contradictions and challenges."

Don has worked as an actor and a director for more than 40 years. His local directing credits include *The* Sweet Lowdown for Broom Street Theatre, Win, Lose, Draw for the Waunakee Actors Guild, and Arsenic and Old Lace for the Evansville Community Theatre.

Before we reveal some of the details about our in-person 2022 offering, I wanted to do a 2021 year-in-review. I'm proud of the resilience and ingenuity of companies in the Madison area over the last couple years, and the Madison Savoyards provided some excellent entertainment, available from the comfort of

your couch.

This past year we focused on creating three virtual events: two centered on Gilbert and Sullivan, and one celebrating the contemporaries of Gilbert and Sullivan.

February's "Winter Arts Mosaic" was recorded in collaboration with Central Midwest Ballet Academy and Upstart Crows. This event featured a newly commissioned song by local composer Mark Wurzelbacher and raised awareness about our youth performing arts community.

August's "I Have a Song to Sing, O!", and December's "An Evening with Gilbert & Sullivan" were freely available to view via our website and Youtube channel, and if you've not seen either, these recordings are still available to watch and share (go to **madisonsavoyards.org** > **Current Season** > **Recent Offerings** and click on the program links).

Our December concert was sponsored by the Unversity League and recorded for their winter Candlelight Concert. They graciously allowed us to share this recording with our followers.

Along with our recorded events, some hearty singers brought holiday cheer to Monroe Street in December, singing holiday carols during the Monroe Street Business Association's Holiday Glow event.

We've learned a lot in the last couple of years about recording voice and accompaniment, and bringing singers together safely during a pandemic that is spread through the breath. We thank our performers for sharing their talent, and persevering in their music in the safest possible way during this time. Thank you to SoundVision studios for providing a sanitized airspace, professional recording, audio and visual editing of our performances this year, and to our supporters, who watch our events online and donate to keep us singing and on the stage.



- I really like the idea of a scaled-down Ruddigore at the Bartell in 2022. I think the venue could work very well.
- We loved that you provided an option to view your last production online. We probably won't be attending the next few productions in person due to risk of covid, so we would like to be able to view your production online again. We would be happy to pay for online viewing tickets.
- The decision to depart from the G&S repertoire that the Board made a couple of years ago was a mistake.
- Have more shows.:-)
