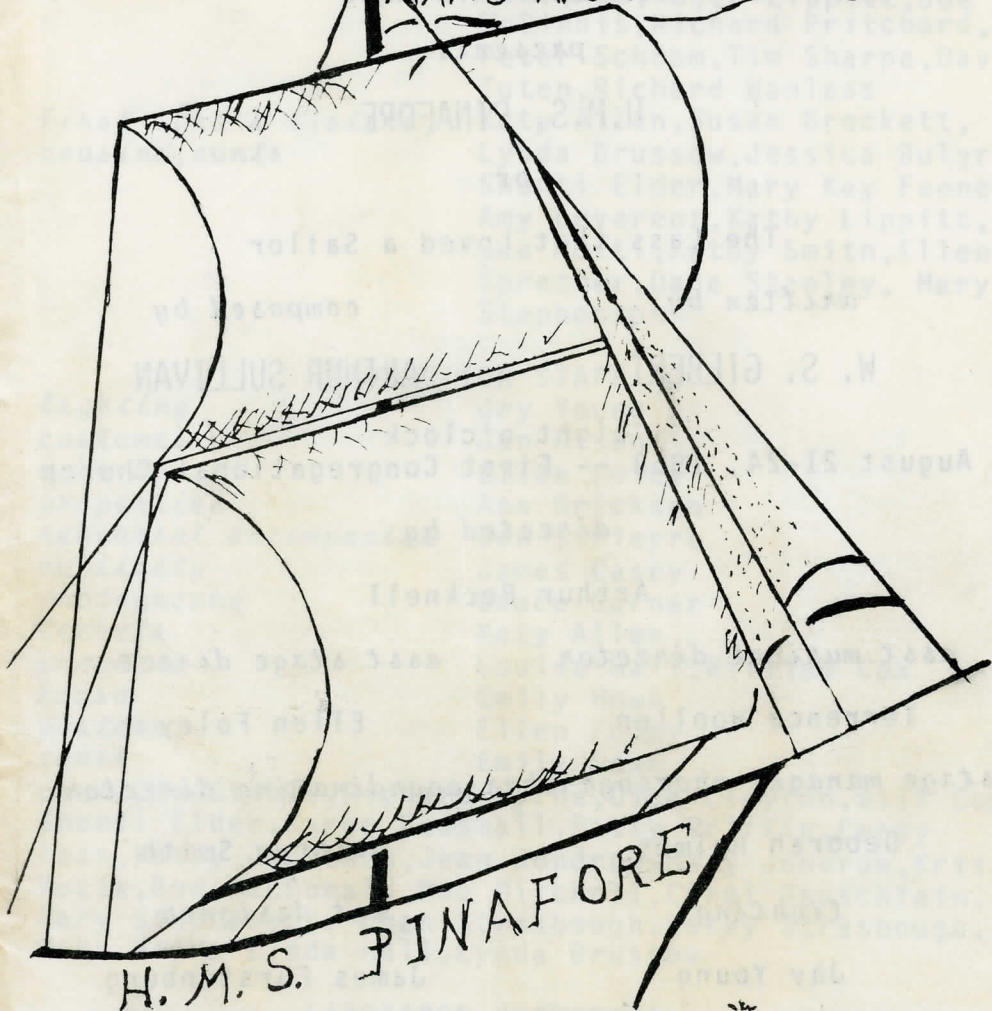

## SYNOPSIS

As Act I opens, the sailors aboard the H.M.S. Pinafore are preparing the ship for the inspection of Sir Joseph Porter, K.C.B. (Knight Commander of the Bath). Sir Joseph comes to marry Josephine, the daughter of Captain Corcoran, who, unknown to him, is secretly in love with Ralph Rackstraw, "a simple sailor lowly born." Sir Joseph appears, accompanied as always by his sisters and his cousins and his aunts (among them is Cousin Hebe, the most devoted of them all). He explains how he came to be Lord of the Admiralty, and encourages the sailors to believe that they are anyone's equal--except his. The happy atmosphere is marred only by Little Buttercup (a buxom peddler-woman) who hints of a dark secret she is hiding, by the grumbling of Dick Deadeye and the lovelorn complaints of Ralph and Josephine.

Josephine, although she finds Sir Joseph quite insufferable, says to Ralph, "Refrain, audacious tar," when he pleads for her love, because he is so far below her station. But when Ralph takes the matter (and a gun) into his own hands and threatens suicide, she admits that she loves him and agrees to elope. The act ends with rejoicing at Ralph's success--only Dick Deadeye croaks "forbear, nor carry out the scheme you've planned."

Act II opens with the Captain in despair at the coldness of his daughter toward Sir Joseph. Little Buttercup attempts to comfort him and warns him that things are seldom what they seem. He agrees, and while doing so he (and she) hint of their love for each other which can never be acknowledged because of the difference in their social positions.

The Captain then suggests to Sir Joseph that perhaps his exalted rank dazzles Josephine, and perhaps Sir Joseph should explain to her that love levels all ranks. This only adds to Josephine's determination to marry Ralph. Dick Deadeye tells the Captain of their plans. To the utter dismay of Sir Joseph and his female relations, he responds with a shocking word! Both Ralph and his Captain are in disgrace when Buttercup reveals her secret: the two were exchanged in infancy. Propriety is restored, freeing both the new and the former Captain to marry his own love.
